In this memoir, Lobrano, whose childhood idea of fine dining was Howard Johnson's, gives insight into how he became one of Paris's most influential food critics.

Ryland Grace is the sole survivor on a desperate, last-chance mission, and if he fails, humanity and the Earth itself will perish. This novel gives the reader a tale of discovery, speculation, and survival.

[Violeta](#) by Isabel Allende

This novel details the epic story of Violeta del Valle, a woman whose life spans one hundred years and bears witness to the greatest upheavals of the twentieth century.

[Plainsong](#) by Kent Haruf

## COMMISSIONER'S MATCHING CHALLENGE GRANT

On Tuesday, April 26th, the Commissioner's Matching Challenge Grant was presented to two representatives of the Towns County Libraries, Marlene Cannon (Branch Manager - MRL and TCPL) and Heath Lee (MRL System Director). This annual grant of \$10,000 is a 50/50 partnership between the Friends of the Library and Towns County Government.

This grant will help both libraries to purchase new library materials and to continue offering programming activities for children and adults. Libraries have taken many state-level funding cuts over the past years so the Matching Challenge Grant was developed to help offset some of these cuts.

## BOOK DONATIONS NEEDED FOR FOLTC BOOKSTORES

Do you have any books that need a new home? Friends of the Libraries (FOLTC) bookstores need books to sell to raise money for our two libraries. In case you don't know, there are bookstores at Mountain Regional Library (MRL) in Young Harris and Towns County Public Library (TCPL) in Hiawassee that sell previously owned and gently used books, DVDs, audiobooks on CD, and jigsaw puzzles.

All the funds raised are donated to our two libraries to purchase new library materials, contribute to programs such as children's summer reading activities, and various other needs.

If you have a large number of books to donate, please bring them to Mountain Regional Library on the first Monday of each month. Smaller donations may be placed in the FOLTC bins (in the lobby of TCPL and inside the bookstore at MRL) during normal library hours. Most types of books may be donated as long as they are in good condition. Currently there is an additional need for the following adult categories: biographies, autobiographies, memoirs, history, military, classics, cookbooks, art books, science, and nature.

Materials that CANNOT be accepted include: books in poor condition; items that are ripped, mildew, smelly; Reader's Digest Condensed books; encyclopedias; religion/spirituality; magazines; textbooks; VHS and audiotapes; medical, computer, or legal books published more than 5 years ago; and music CDs. These items do not sell, so please do not donate them to the Friends.
