

26TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION!

In February 1996 43 local people founded Friends of the Libraries of Towns County with the purpose of raising funds to purchase library materials, support library programs, and advocate for all public libraries. Within a short time FOLTC was established as a non-profit organization (501C3). The majority of funds raised comes from book sales, bake sales (pre-pandemic), and membership dues. It is hoped to resume bake sales in the near future as they are very popular and are great fundraisers.

The board of directors decided to celebrate the 26th anniversary with a catered luncheon which will take place on Monday, December 12th, at noon at the Fellowship Hall in Sharp Memorial UMC. The annual meeting and election of officers will take place following the luncheon. A short musical program will be provided by Sharp Tones, one of the church's musical groups. There is a \$12 per person charge for the lunch, and payment must be received by December 1st. Please see the invitation and the registration form below. LIBRARY HAPPENINGS

In late July we received a grant to become a part of the Rosalynn Carter Butterfly Garden Trail. With this money and a lot of help from our wonderful Master Gardeners, we were able to beautify the outdoor space at Towns County Public Library. We also participated in the Back to School Bash as part of the Family Connections, which allowed us to connect with families and give them information on how the library can help serve the community.

In September we launched the PLAY Card. This is a connection between the Georgia Public Library Service and the Towns County School System. Every student registered as a Towns County student is automatically enrolled in the program which gives them a personalized number that allows them to check out materials from the library. They can check out up to five items at a time, with no late fees or fines. This program provides library access for children in the community.

The library participated in the Appalachian Trail day this year, spending the day with other businesses



in the community and talking to tourists. Staff also completed a huge project at the Mountain Regional Branch: tagging every single one of our items! This project is ongoing but will ultimately allow us to check books in and out much faster. We could not have completed this project without our volunteers.

In October we kicked off Storytime at Towns County. This was something our community needed, and we look forward to seeing it grow. October 10th was our Staff Development Day. Staff from all MRLS branch libraries were able to gather together at the Union County Chamber for a day of learning and fellowship. A big thank you to our Friends for their donation, which gave us a budget to make

this day special for employees. We participated in the City of Hiawassee's Halloween at the Fairgrounds. Pictured above is Marlene Cannon ready for trick or treaters.

We are continuing our monthly cultural celebrations. On November 16th from 3:30 - 4:30, we will be having a Native American cultural celebration with books and food. Storytime at Towns County Library will continue every Tuesday at 10:30.

Black Cake by Charmaine Wilkerson

This debut novel is an extraordinary journey through the life of a family changed forever by the choices of its matriarch.

Body & Soul by Frank Conroy

<u>Lessons in Chemistry</u> by Bonnie Garmus

Garmus' novel is set in America in the 1960s and follows the life of a single mother, Elizabeth Zott, a brilliant chemist in a man's world. Elizabeth becomes an unlikely cooking-show host and the role model her daughter deserves.
