FOLTC BOOKSTORES’ INVENTORY REDUCTION SALE IN FEBRUARY

With the arrival of a new year, the Friends decided to have an Inventory Reduction Sale at both FOLTC bookstores during the entire month of February. Every book on the shelves will be sold at reduced prices. **Please note that the shelves will NOT be restocked during the sale.** The goal is to sell all the books before bringing out donated books in storage at the beginning of March. Thanks to the many donations of preowned

books made to the bookstores, room is needed to put “new” titles on the shelves so shoppers have more choices for purchase.

This will be an ‘honor system’ book sale. Exact change or checks written to FOLTC must be placed in each bookstores’ red money box. Adult hardback books will cost \$1.00 each. Paperbacks and all children’s and young adult books will be \$.25 each or 5/\$1.00. CDs, DVDs, and jigsaw puzzles will be \$.25 each.

The Inventory Reduction Sale will take place from **February 1st to February 29th** during regular library hours. Mountain Regional Library, 698 Miller St., Young Harris, is open on Mondays - Thursdays from 10:00 – 5:00. Towns County Public Library, 99 S. Berrong St., Hiawassee, is open on Tuesdays – Fridays from 10:00 – 6:00.

If you are interested in donating books for FOLTC bookstores, there is a regular monthly donation day: Mountain Regional Library on the first Monday of each month; Towns County Public Library on the first Tuesday of each month. Donations will not be accepted in February. Please visit our website at www.foltc.com. Click on the Events tab and then Book Donations for the list of the types of items that are accepted to be placed in the bookstores and those that are not accepted.

The Friends of the Libraries of Towns County bookstores are able to operate and raise funds for the libraries thanks to the generous donations of preowned books by members of FOLTC and the communities.

Every book that is purchased generates funds that are given to Mountain Regional Library and Towns County Public Library to supplement their revenue for new books and other library materials, children’s and adult programs, staff development, and other requests by library staff.

LIBRARY HAPPENINGS



The second quarter of FY2024 has been a resounding success. Firstly, Storytime is maintaining its non-summer levels of participation with an average attendance of 14. Last quarter we started a toddler Stay and Play which was off to a rather slow start. The program is catching on a bit more now though the numbers of

attendees average in the single digits, people are letting others know and intentionally meeting at the library with their small children. The original goal of the program was to provide a place for parents and children to socialize and meet to play. With that in mind, I would say that the program is being successful.

Our Halloween Carnival was held on the 26th of October and brought in just over 30 patrons, many of them in costume! They were able to participate in 'ghost' bowling, ring toss, and other carnival style games while getting candy and popcorn! Our pumpkin carving/decorating contest saw several entries, and the winner won books, a bag, and reading light.



Hot Chocolate and Homework, which we started in October, hasn't taken off. We are still advertising it on our monthly calendar but as of now, no students have taken part. We launched Bingo as a monthly adult program in November. So far, the feedback we have received is positive and there are several who have said they expect to

bring friends for future dates.

Last but not least, we ended the quarter with "Cookies with the Grinch!" This year saw a very large turnout both for the event (68) and the Storytime (47) just before it. Our newest hire at the library, Rachel Singleton, was our Grinch and posed for many photos with



patrons at our Christmas tree. Children and adults alike decorated sugar cookies with sprinkles, marshmallows, and icing while dining on popcorn, candy, festive Chex mix, and Grinch punch!

In the third quarter of FY2024 we plan to continue with our regular programming of Storytime, Bingo, and Stay and Play. We will also be putting on a February program in co-operation with the Master Gardeners and the extension service centering around the Great Backyard Bird Count. The current plan is to offer patrons the chance to not only observe birds and learn about the bird count but to make and decorate a bird house. A second program, revolving

around the beginning of growing season, will begin the planning phase in late February or early March. Summer Reading Program planning is also starting in the third quarter with the theme of “Adventure Begins at your Library.”

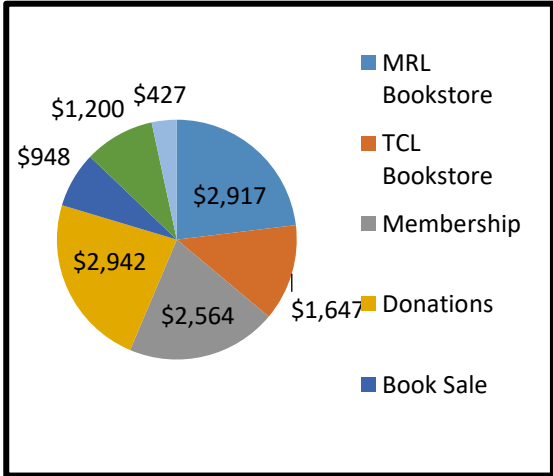

NEWS FROM OUR TREASURER

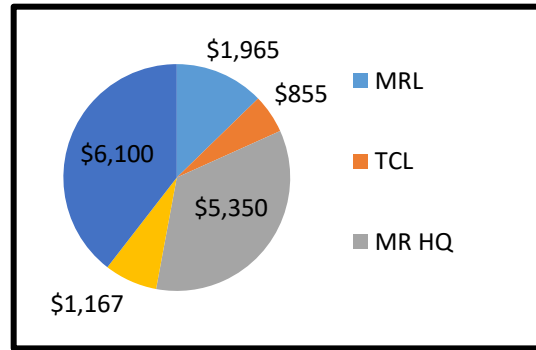
FOLTC INCOME
