#### 'BEST FRIEND' AWARD GOES TO DORIS TILLY

Tilly Doris finally received her 'Best Friend' award from Friends of Georgia Libraries (FOGL) at a small ceremony held in Sharp Memorial United Methodist Church's Fellowship Hall on Oct. 29<sup>th</sup>. The speakers were introduced by Barbara



Hale of the Towns County local library board. Donna Howell, former director of Mountain Regional Library

System, spoke of Doris' long history with the Towns County libraries and the many ways she has contributed to the libraries. Dan Aldridge, FOGL President, presented the award and spoke of the value of libraries to all people. He said that everyone probably has a library story from his/her childhood. Doris' story occurred when she was 4 years old and her grandmother took her to their small local library. She read every book in that library, some of her favorites being Greek & Roman Mythology and Nancy Drew mysteries. Thus began Doris' life-long passion for public libraries, including initiating the beginning of the Friends of the Libraries of Towns County in 1996. The ceremony ended with a prayer by the church's Reverend Stephen Soulen. Doris was announced as the award winner in April, but the presentation was delayed due to the pandemic.

Reading should not be presented to children as a chore, a duty. It should be offered as a gift.

Doris is the founding member of FOLTC and was elected to serve as its first president. She has been an active member since 1996 and has served in a variety of capacities. She continues to support the Towns County libraries both physically (volunteers at all book sales) and financially. When Mountain Regional Library was renovated in 2016, Doris donated significant funds in memory of her daughter to help complete and furnish the Children's Room. The beauty and welcoming nature of the Children's Room is a testament to Doris' love of children, books, and especially her daughter.

#### SECOND LITTLE FREE LIBRARY IN TOWNS COUNTY

Elaine Roberts, current FOLTC president, suggested earlier in the year that the Friends of the Libraries of Towns County (FOLTC) consider sponsoring a Little Free Library at the Towns County Beach and Playground west of Hiawassee. This would be the 2<sup>nd</sup> Little Free Library in the county; the first is located at Mayor's Park in Young Harris. The board members agreed that it would be great idea, County Commissioner Bradshaw agreed with the plan, and Friend and library patron Jerome Laux was approached about building it. After it was completed, Dick Aunspaugh (another FOLTC member) agreed to decorate it and put the FOLTC name on it. It was recently installed at the Playground (by Jerome Laux and Bruce Roberts) next to the pavilion and really brightens up the area. Look for the bright yellow box with colorful flowers on it! Thank you to everyone



who participated in this project! FOLTC members will keep it stocked with books.

This is a "nonprofit organization that inspires a love of reading, builds community, and sparks creativity by fostering neighborhood book exchanges around the world." The book-sharing program was begun in 2009 when Todd Bol of Wisconsin built a model of a one-room schoolhouse as a tribute to his mother who was a teacher and loved to read. There are now over 100,000 registered Little Free Libraries in more than 100 countries worldwide.

#### A PROFITABLE SURPRISE FROM BETTER WORLD BOOKS

Several years ago FOLTC began partnering with Better World Books, an online bookseller whose profits support literacy efforts around the world. Initially, they allowed us, at no cost for shipping, to send them any books that we were not able to sell through our bookstore or book sales. As shipping rates continued to rise, we were then required to pre-screen any books before sending them and only send them (still at no cost for shipping) books that were needed in their inventory. In exchange for our efforts in pre-screening, they agreed to pay us a small percentage of any of "our" books that they sold.

FOLTC received a surprise check in September for \$280!!! This could not have come at a better time, given our present circumstances of limited fundraising opportunities due to COVID-19.

Thanks to all who donate books to FOLTC because they help us raise funds for our libraries via some surprisingly unconventional ways!

## **COVID-19 VIRUS IMPACT ON FOLTC**

Like most non-profits, FOLTC has had its contributions greatly impacted by COVID-19. From January 1 to October 31, 2019, through book sales, membership dues, and pie and bake sales among other sources, FOLTC collected \$15,517 to use to help support the Towns County libraries.

2020 saw a major decline in income. For the January 1 to October 31, 2020 period, FOLTC only collected \$5,456 or 35% of what we did for the same period in 2019. This mainly is due to the COVID-19 prevention guidelines not allowing us to hold major book and bake/pie sales and Mountain Regional Library's reduced staffing and hours that only allows the FOLTC Bookstore to be open 2 days a week.

FOLTC has been able to meet all the requests of the libraries this year but, if the virus and Mountain Regional Library hours remain the same, we may not be able to in 2021. We know that the Towns

County community will continue its support of FOLTC's efforts to support children and adult programs and book purchases to help MRLS remain one of the best library systems in Georgia.

#### HONOR SYSTEM FOLTC BOOK SALE

COVID-19 has limited our ability to host fundraisers for the libraries. However, their need for support continues, prompting FOLTC to get creative about how to meet your desire to shop our incredible book sales and generate funds for the libraries.
